## **Response to ABC Gippsland**

"There are some points I would like to make in writing for your program and which I am most happy for you to share with your listeners.

The Royal Commission has undertaken exhaustive work into the failings of the Marist Brothers in the past and also countless other institutions - religious, non-religious, government and non-government alike.

Our failings reflect those found in a common thread across almost every Australian institution - children were not properly protected and when complaints were raised, they were not acted upon as they should have.

On behalf of the Marist Brothers I have placed on the record - in public and in private - our acknowledgment of these failings, the damage that they have caused and the great hurt, suffering and pain that has resulted for individuals, their families and communities across Australia including Traralgon, Gippsland and the Sale Diocese. The apology I have made publicly and privately is unreserved and enduring. That any child could be so harmed and failed when in the care of the Marist Brothers is a matter of profound sorrow yet it is what tragically occurred. We cannot undo the past however we can work to ensure that it does not occur again.

Our mission is supported by mandated and voluntary policies and procedures to protect children. Central to this are the provisions of mandatory reporting legislation which applies to all individuals, religious and lay alike." - Br Peter Carroll FMS, Provincial
